- E. Kristy Sturge Recess times difficult to supervise so many students at recess
 - Would having 2 separate recess times for Divisions be an option?
 - Recognizes that there are logistical issues
 - Paul discussed the teacher break times and how it would be difficult to find enough supervision
 - We stagger recesses with SMP, making it difficult to change recess times
 - Hot lunch makes it difficult to stagger lunch
 - We also have too many student to use the gym Mme Lindsay does organize intramurals during the winter
 - Luana asked about putting in another playground
 - There used to be more but the city pulled it out
 - They replaced some but not all
 - Thomas explained that we have a basketball pad, but the city hasn't put in nets
 - Dana asked what spaces students are allowed to play
 - We do have a sliding hill teachers can take their class out supervised
 - Kristy explained that sometimes the older kids have trouble finding activities to keep them occupied at recess
 - Mrs. Webb runs a playground club there are grade 5&6 leaders who take the equipment out to play
 - We have 3 recesses 15 mins AM; 15 mins at lunch; 15 mins PM
 - We added another supervisor so that students could go further in the field
 - Parents as supervisors do need to be paid would be a nice option but there are budgetary reasons that it hasn't been adopted
 - Jessica suggested that we talk to other large schools to see how they face
